

Code of Conduct for Parents and Carers

As a parent or carer of a child or young person participating in our activities—whether it's club events, or national competitions—Pentathlon GB greatly value your support and involvement. To ensure a positive experience for everyone, this friendly Code of Conduct for parents and carers, highlighting the behaviours we encourage and those we'd like to avoid.

What We Encourage:

- 1. Open Communication: Take a moment to talk to your child about their sporting journey. Ask them about their goals and what they enjoy the most.
- 2. Celebrate Everyone: Cheer for all participants. Applaud both individual and team efforts, no matter the outcome.
- 3. Enjoyment First: Remind your child that the joy of participating is what truly matters. Winning is great, but having fun is what keeps them coming back.
- 4. Embrace Sportsmanship: Talk about the importance of playing by the rules and showing respect for everyone on the field.
- 5. Be Mindful Online: When using social media or communication apps, let's keep our interactions positive and respectful.
- 6. Share Important Info: If your child has any health or welfare concerns, please share these with the coach, welfare officer or team manager so they can provide the best support.
- 7. Respect Everyone: Treat all individuals equally, embracing diversity in age, ability, gender, race, religion, social status, and sexual orientation. Everyone deserves to feel safe and protected.

What We'd Like to Avoid:

- Negative Comments: Please refrain from punishing, belittling, or shouting at your child or any young participant, whether in person or online. Let's keep the focus on positivity.
- Inappropriate Language: Avoid using any foul, sexist, or racist language or gestures.
- Field of Play: Please stay off the field unless invited by a coach or official.
- Supportive Environment: Help us maintain a positive atmosphere by not condoning any behaviour that goes against our Code of Conduct.
- Rule Violations: Let's encourage fair play and adherence to the rules, steering clear of any prohibited substances or behaviours.



Our Commitment:

Pentathlon GB believe that by following this Code of Conduct, they can create a nurturing and enjoyable environment for all our young athletes. If any concerns arise regarding behaviour that contradicts these guidelines, Pentathlon GB will address them with the parent directly, aiming for a quick and friendly resolution.

Pentathlon GB will take positive action if we believe you have breached the Code of Conduct for Parents/ Carers and reserve the right to remove you from an event/ competition and follow our safeguarding and disciplinary procedures.
